HOW TO GET TO GDAŃSK

STEP 3: Plan your arrival in Gdańsk

Gdańsk is served by Gdańsk Lech Wałęsa Airport (GDN), located about 12 km (7.5 miles) northwest of the city center. The airport connects Gdańsk with many European cities and some international destinations, making it easy to reach by plane.

Many airlines offer direct flights to Gdańsk, particularly from Northern and Western Europe. You can also reach Gdańsk via connecting flights through Warsaw Chopin Airport or other major European hubs, such as: London, Paris, Frankfurt, Amsterdam, Stockholm, Copenhagen, Oslo.

From the Airport to the City Center

Once you arrive at Gdańsk Airport, there are several convenient options to reach the city center:

Train: The PKM train connects the airport to the main train station (Gdańsk Główny) or Gdańsk Wrzeszcz in about 25 minutes. Tickets are inexpensive and trains run frequently.

Bus: Several city buses (e.g., lines 110 and 210) go to the city center. The ride takes about 30–40 minutes.

Taxi or Ride-Sharing: Taxis and services like Bolt or Uber are available at the airport. The ride to the city center usually takes 20–30 minutes.

Car Rental: Several car rental companies operate at the airport if you prefer to drive yourself.

Travel Tips

Check in advance if your flight arrives during peak hours, as traffic and queues may be longer.

Gdańsk Airport has free Wi-Fi, luggage storage, and helpful tourist information desks.

If you haven't brought any Polish currency (złoty – PLN), there's no need to worry – card payments are widely accepted throughout Poland.

ACCOMODATION

STEP 4: Choose a place to stay

Gdańsk is a popular tourist city, so finding accommodation is easy. Most hotels are located around the Old Town (e.g., Puro, Radisson, Hampton by Hilton Gdańsk, Stay Inn Hotel, Ibis, Central Hotel), but you can also find options in the center of Sopot (one of Poland's most famous seaside resorts) and, a bit further away, in the center of Gdynia

It's worth knowing that Gdańsk, Sopot, and Gdynia form the Tricity. Their residents often say they live in the Tricity.

If you prefer accommodation closer to the university, the following hotels are nearby: Hampton by Hilton Gdańsk Oliwa, Hotel Arkon Park, Hotel Oliwski, and Focus Hotel Premium.

STEP 5: Find out what's worth seeing and doing in Gdańsk

Gdańsk, located on the Baltic coast of Poland, is a vibrant city with a rich history, unique architecture, and a lively cultural scene. Known as the birthplace of the Solidarity movement, Gdańsk offers a fascinating blend of historical charm and modern attractions.

Gdańsk is famous for its fresh seafood, traditional Polish dishes, and international cuisine. Don't miss local specialties like pierogi, żurek (sour rye soup), or smoked fish from the Baltic Sea.

From the center of Gdańsk you can get there as follows:

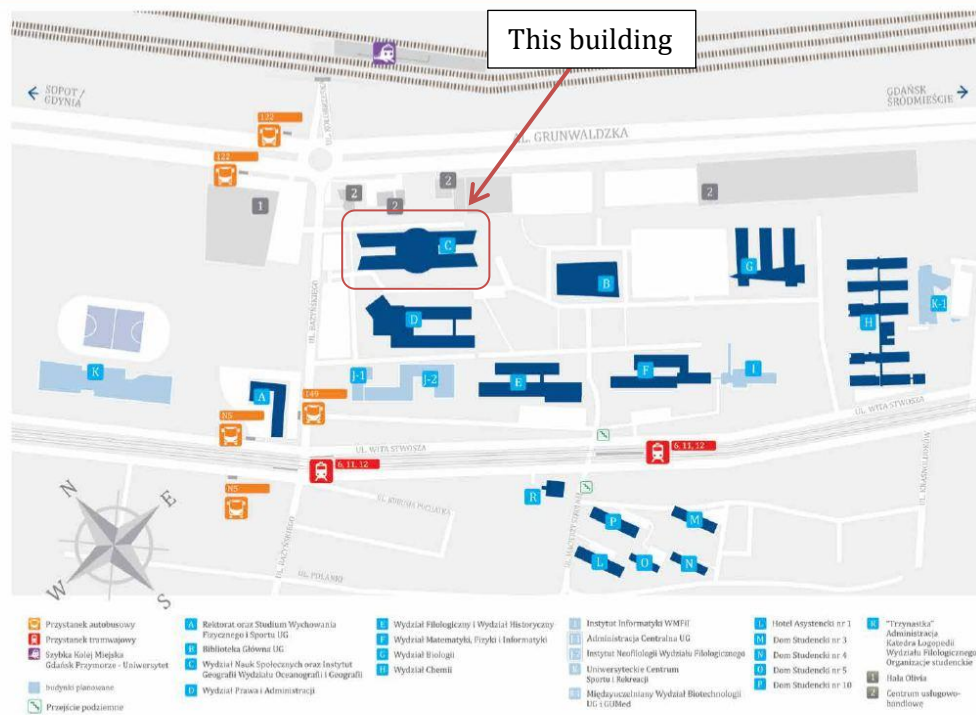
- SKM suburban train: 15–20 minutes, stop: Gdańsk Przymorze – Uniwersytet (every 8–10 minutes).
- Tram (no. 6 or 12): 30 minutes, stops: Gdańsk Uniwersytet or Gdańsk Bażyńskiego.
- Taxi / Uber / Bolt: widely available and affordable.
